Since graduating in 2009, former Wee Waa High School School Captain, Andrew Patten has been on an exciting trajectory of education, discovery and entrepreneurial endeavour.

Mr Patten recalled that his Air Force gap year commenced in Point Cook, Victoria where his days started at 5.30am.

"It was pretty much like boot camp. Then after three months we were moved to Newcastle and three months later to Amberley in Queensland for the rest of the gap year." he said.

"The Air Force was the perfect first step after high school and it really helped me to develop my confidence and self-discipline as well as skills for my future.

During year 12, I had also successfully applied to Charles Sturt University (CSU) in Wagga to study Graphic Design, deferring their offer to do my military gap year. I took up the offer the following year. My course, or rather living in a regional centre like Wagga wasn't really what I wanted. I came to realise I was really looking for more of a metro - city experience, so I decided to put my studies on hold and move to Melbourne and get a job in the graphic design field.

Once I got there I realised just how competitive the industry is. I was working part-time but it wasn't leading anywhere, so I decided I should broaden my knowledge and skills further."

Having really enjoyed studying business at high school, Mr Patten decided to undertake a two year Associate Degree in Business at the Royal Melbourne Institute of Technology.

Fast forward, he has just graduated from RMIT.

"It was the perfect course for me as it gave me a much boarder knowledge of the fundamentals of business, which was just what I was looking for," Mr Patten said.

Having dabbled with different business ideas since leaving school, it was in 2014 that Mr Patten seized upon the idea of developing products for men to use on their beards.
