"They work amazingly well together,

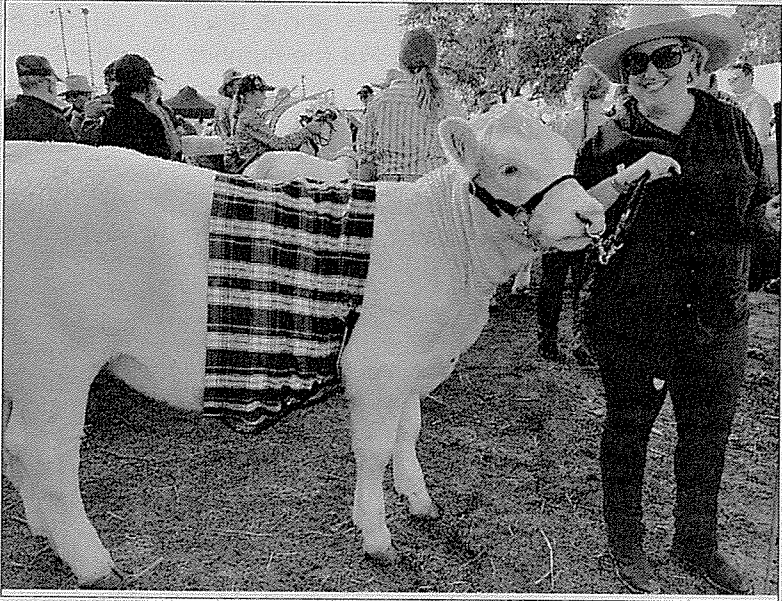
never complaining about the long days, the rain or the mud.
